\$88 Million Breastfeeding Peer Counseling (BFPC) Grants : In FY 2026, State agencies with approved State Plan amendments will receive their share of the \$88 million available for BFPC. State agency funding amounts are calculated using the BFPC funding formula, which is based on the State agency's share of the national average number of pregnant and breastfeeding women who could benefit from a peer counseling program and the average local government salary. If any State agency does not accept all of its minimum allocation, remaining funds will be allocated among all State agencies that have submitted an approved State Plan amendment and have accepted their full amount of funds. Funds will be allocated on a pro-rata basis once all State Plan amendments for FY 2026 are received and reviewed.

\$2 Million Breastfeeding Bonus Awards: In FY 2026, FNS will award \$2 million to up to 15 State agencies with the highest rates of fully breastfed infants in FY 2025 that did not have a decrease in breastfeeding rates from FY 2024 to FY 2025. The total award amount each State agency will receive is based on the number of fully breastfed infants participating in WIC, with a minimum award amount of \$5,000 and a maximum of \$1,000,000. State agencies that received an award in FY 2025 will not be eligible for an award in FY 2026.

Infrastructure: Apportionment Row: 6013

Line 6013 represents \$13,600,000 for Infrastructure expenses under the Full-Year Continuing Appropriations, Agriculture, Legislative Branch, military Construction and Veterans Affairs, and Extensions Act, 2026 (PL 119-37), based on section 17(h)(10)(B)(i) of the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 (42 U.S.C. 1786). The funding supports WIC program infrastructure grants.

Please note that WIC Infrastructure was provided \$13,600,000 in 26/27. Carryover funds apportioned to this line are \$10,678,914.

SPEND PLAN: WIC GENERAL INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDS (FY 2025 and 2026)

FNS plans to make WIC General Infrastructure Funds available to all WIC State agencies via a complete grant process. We will offer \$24,278,914.00, the total of all carryover funds from FY 2025, as well as the full amount of FY 2026 funds. WIC State agencies will be allowed to apply for a grant amount that corresponds to their total caseload. We expect awards from \$25,000 to \$5M to be made under this award. Using historical data and considering the amount of funding available, we expect approximately 40 awards (out of 88 State agencies). These awards are offered approximately annually and structured to meet current needs and priorities to improve the WIC Program.

Awards will be available to support Promoting Program Integrity to Minimize Waste, Fraud, and Abuse in the WIC Program; Creating Opportunities to Connect America’s Farmers to WIC; and Developing and Implementing Modernized Technology. These are consistent with Secretary Rollins priorities that FNS programs are operated with integrity and honor taxpayer sacrifices, and that programs modernize technology, which in many cases improves customer service as well.

Line 6016 represents \$32,590,000 for Federal Administrative and Program Initiative expenses under the Continuing Appropriations, Agriculture, Legislative Branch, Military Construction and Veteran Affairs, and Extensions Act, 2026 (PL 119-37), based on section 17 of the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 (42 U.S.C. 1786) which provides general authority for FNS to administer the WIC program. The funding is to support Federal administration and program oversight.

Please note that Federal Admin & Program Initiatives was provided \$32,590,000 in 26/27 funds. Carryover funds apportioned to this line are \$23,008,361.
